RE: Annual Mailing

As in previous years, enclosed are two notices that are provided as required by law. There is no action that you are required to take and there is no change to the benefits provided under the Plan. The **Annual Funding Notice** covers the 2022 calendar year (although parts of this notice reflect the finances of the Plan as of December 31, 2021 rather than December 31, 2022). As you will note from this notice the Plan's "funded percentage" (for purposes of the Pension Protection Act of 2006 ("PPA")) was 50.6%. The **Notice of Critical Status** covers the current calendar year based on projections as of December 31, 2022 (and does not include investment returns after that date). You will note that the Plan remains in critical and declining status under PPA, as amended by the Multiemployer Pension Reform Act of 2014 (MPRA), for the current year.

IMPORTANT:

As we previously advised you, under the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) that became law in March 2021, the Plan is eligible for financial assistance from the federal government in an amount intended to allow it to continue to pay out all promised benefits through 2051. The Plan submitted an application for financial assistance on March 7, 2023. As of the date these notices were finalized, the PBGC was in the process of reviewing the Plan's application, and therefore the figures and projections contained in the attached notices do not reflect the financial assistance that the Plan anticipates it will receive under ARPA (except for the paragraph in the Annual Funding Notice entitled *Events Having a Material Effect on Assets or Liabilities*). **Please note that your benefits will not change due to the receipt of financial assistance, but the assistance is expected to allow the Plan to pay your benefits for many years into the future.**

Additionally, please note the following important reminders:

- **Filing an appeal of a denial for benefits: As we previously advised,** if your claim for benefits from the Plan was denied and your time to file an appeal would have expired on or after March 1, 2020, your time to file an appeal is extended for a period of one year (or until 60 days following the announced end of the Outbreak

Period announced by the government, if earlier). The Biden administration recently announced that the Outbreak Period will end on May 11, 2023. Accordingly, unless this date changes (in which case you will be advised), all usual Plan deadlines will resume on that date.

For example, if your claim was denied on September 1, 2021, the October 31, 2021 appeal deadline was extended through October 31, 2022. If your claim was denied on September 1, 2022, your October 31, 2022 appeal deadline will be extended through July 10, 2023.

- **You may start** your “age” pension as early as age 65 or once you stop working in covered employment, if later. Covered employment is employment for which contributions are being made to the Plan on your behalf. Please contact the Administrative Agency for an application or more information at the phone number, address or email address below.
- **If you move**, please let us know your new address by contacting the Administrative Agency at the phone number, address or email address below.

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Annual Funding Notice For National Integrated Group Pension Plan

Introduction

This notice includes important information about the funding status of your multiemployer pension plan ("the Plan"). It also includes general information about the benefit payments guaranteed by the Pension Benefit Guaranty Corporation (PBGC), a federal insurance agency. All traditional pension plans (called "defined benefit pension plans") must provide this notice every year regardless of their funding status. This notice does not mean that the plan is terminating. It is provided for informational purposes and you are not required to respond in any way. This notice is required by federal law. This notice is for the plan year beginning January 1, 2022 and ending December 31, 2022 ("Plan Year").

How Well Funded is Your Plan

The law requires the administrator of the Plan to tell you how well the Plan is funded, using a measure called the "funded percentage." The Plan divides its assets by its liabilities on the Valuation Date for the plan year to get this percentage. In general, the higher the percentage, the better funded the plan. The Plan's funded percentage for the Plan Year and each of the two preceding plan years is shown in the chart below. The chart also states the value of the Plan's assets and liabilities for the same period.

Year-End Fair Market Value of Assets

The asset values in the chart above are measured as of the Valuation Date. These asset values are the fair market value of the assets on the Valuation Date. For your additional information, the year-end fair market value of the Plan's assets for funding purposes for the Plan Year and for the two preceding plan years was: \$645,750,518 as of December 31, 2022 (estimated); \$840,733,399 as of December 31, 2021; and \$805,591,640 as of December 31, 2020.

Endangered, Critical or Critical and Declining Status

Under federal pension law, a plan generally is in "endangered" status if its funded percentage is less than 80 percent. A plan is in "critical" status if the funded percentage is less than 65 percent (other factors may also apply). A plan is in "critical and declining" status if it is in critical status and is projected to become insolvent (run out of money to pay benefits) within 15 years (or within 20 years if a special rule applies). If a pension plan enters endangered status, the trustees of the plan are required to adopt a funding improvement plan. Similarly, if a pension plan enters critical status, the trustees of the plan are required to adopt a rehabilitation plan. Funding improvement and rehabilitation plans establish steps and benchmarks for pension plans to improve their funding status over a specified period of time. The plan sponsor of a plan in critical and declining status may apply for approval to amend the plan to reduce current and future payment obligations to participants and beneficiaries.

The Plan was in “critical and declining” status in the Plan Year ending December 31, 2022 because the Plan’s actuary determined that there was a funding deficiency for the current Plan Year. Additionally, the funded percentage was less than 80% and insolvency is projected within 20 years. The Plan is projected to be insolvent in the 2032 Plan Year. Such insolvency may result in benefit reductions. In an effort to improve the Plan's funding situation, the trustees adopted a Rehabilitation Plan on November 25, 2009. The Rehabilitation Plan imposes benefit reductions on participants with respect to whom no employer is currently obligated to make contributions and includes two schedules of benefit reductions and contribution increases, a Preferred Schedule and a Default Schedule, that have been provided to the participating employers and unions for purposes of collective bargaining and adoption. The Plan has provided two Notices of Reductions in Adjustable Benefits Under the Rehabilitation Plan to all participants and beneficiaries of the Plan whose benefits may be affected by the Rehabilitation Plan, one dated April 30, 2010, and one dated December 1, 2012. These Notices describe the specific benefit reductions that are imposed under the Rehabilitation Plan. The benefit reductions described in each Notice do not apply to participants or beneficiaries in pay status as of the Notice date. The rehabilitation period began on January 1, 2012, and the Rehabilitation Plan as amended from time to time is expected to continue indefinitely. You may obtain a copy of the Plan's Rehabilitation Plan, any update to such plan and the actuarial and financial data that demonstrate any action taken by the Plan toward fiscal improvement. You may get this information by contacting the Administrative Agency.

The Plan remains in “critical and declining” status for the plan year beginning January 1, 2023, and ending December 31, 2023. A separate notification of that status is enclosed.

Participant Information

The total number of participants in the Plan as of the Plan’s 2022 Valuation Date was 46,940. Of this number, 3,537 were current employees, 21,404 were retired or separated from service and receiving benefits, and 21,999 were retired or separated from service and entitled to future benefits.

Funding & Investment Policies

Every pension plan must have a procedure for establishing a funding policy to carry out the plan objectives. A funding policy relates to the level of assets needed to pay promised benefits. The Plan's funding policy is to maintain a trust to hold and invest contributions made by participating employers pursuant to collective bargaining agreements and earnings on investments over time.

Pension plans also have investment policies. These generally are written guidelines or general instructions for making investment management decisions. In brief summary, the investment policy of the Plan is to maximize investment returns within prudent levels of risk through portfolio diversification across different classes of assets by establishing, from time to time, guidelines and target allocation ranges for the Plan's investments in the different asset classes. With the assistance of an Investment Consultant, the Trustees select qualified investment managers to manage the Plan's investments under the investment policy guidelines by making specific investments in these asset classes through commingled investment vehicles.

In accordance with the Plan’s investment policy, the Plan’s assets were allocated among the following categories of investments, as of the end of the Plan Year. These allocations are percentages of total assets:

Events Having a Material Effect on Assets or Liabilities

By law this notice must contain a written explanation of new events that have a material effect on Plan liabilities or assets. This is because such events can significantly impact the funding condition of a plan. For the plan year beginning January 1, 2023 and ending on December 31, 2023, the Plan expects the following events to have such an effect:

The Plan submitted its application to PBGC for Special Financial Assistance (SFA) under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 on March 7, 2023. If the application is approved without modification the Plan will receive \$868,135,702 plus interest from December 31, 2022 to the date of payment. Receipt of SFA will materially increase Plan assets and improve the funded percentage of the Plan, enabling the Plan to pay benefits for many years into the future.

Right to Request a Copy of the Annual Report

Pension plans must file annual reports with the US Department of Labor. The report is called the "Form 5500." These reports contain financial and other information. You may obtain an electronic copy of your Plan's annual report by going to www.efast.dol.gov and using the search tool. Annual reports also are available from the US Department of Labor, Employee Benefits Security

Administration's Public Disclosure Room at 200 Constitution Avenue, NW, Room N-1513, Washington, DC 20210, or by calling 202.693.8673. Or you may obtain a copy of the Plan's annual report by making a written request to the Administrative Agency. Annual reports do not contain personal information, such as the amount of your accrued benefit. You may contact the Administrative Agency if you want information about your accrued benefits. The contact information for the Administrative Agency is provided below under "Where to Get More Information."

Summary of Rules Governing Insolvent Plans

Federal law has a number of special rules that apply to financially troubled multiemployer plans that become insolvent, either as ongoing plans or plans terminated by mass withdrawal. The plan administrator is required by law to include a summary of these rules in the annual funding notice. A plan is insolvent for a plan year if its available financial resources are not sufficient to pay benefits when due for that plan year. An insolvent plan must reduce benefit payments to the highest level that can be paid from the plan's available resources. If such resources are not enough to pay benefits at the level specified by law (see Benefit Payments Guaranteed by the PBGC, below), the plan must apply to the PBGC for financial assistance. The PBGC will loan the plan the amount necessary to pay benefits at the guaranteed level. Reduced benefits may be restored if the plan's financial condition improves.

A plan that becomes insolvent must provide prompt notice of its status to participants and beneficiaries, contributing employers, labor unions representing participants, and PBGC. In addition, participants and beneficiaries also must receive information regarding whether, and how, their benefits will be reduced or affected as a result of the insolvency, including loss of a lump sum option.

Benefit Payments Guaranteed by the PBGC

The maximum benefit that the PBGC guarantees is set by law. Only benefits that you have earned a right to receive and that cannot be forfeited (called vested benefits) are guaranteed. There are separate insurance programs with different benefit guarantees and other provisions for single-employer plans and multiemployer plans. Your Plan is covered by PBGC's multiemployer program. Specifically, the PBGC guarantees a monthly benefit payment equal to 100 percent of the first \$11 of the Plan's monthly benefit accrual rate, plus 75 percent of the next \$33 of the accrual rate, times each year of credited service. The PBGC's maximum guarantee, therefore, is \$35.75 per month times a participant's years of credited service.

Example 1: If a participant with 10 years of credited service has an accrued monthly benefit of \$600, the accrual rate for purposes of determining the PBGC guarantee would be determined by dividing the monthly benefit by the participant's years of service ($\$600/10$), which equals \$60. The guaranteed amount for a \$60 monthly accrual rate is equal to the sum of \$11 plus $\$24.75 (.75 \times \$33)$, or \$35.75. Thus, the participant's guaranteed monthly benefit is $\$357.50 (\$35.75 \times 10)$.

Example 2: If the participant in Example 1 has an accrued monthly benefit of \$200, the accrual rate for purposes of determining the guarantee would be \$20 (or $\$200/10$). The guaranteed amount for a \$20 monthly accrual rate is equal to the sum of \$11 plus $\$6.75 (.75 \times \$9)$, or \$17.75. Thus, the participant's guaranteed monthly benefit would be $\$177.50 (17.75 \times 10)$.

The PBGC guarantees pension benefits payable at normal retirement age and some early retirement benefits. In addition, the PBGC guarantees qualified preretirement survivor benefits (which are preretirement death benefits payable to the surviving spouse of a participant who dies before starting to receive benefit payments). In calculating a person's monthly payment, the PBGC will disregard any benefit increases that were made under a plan within 60 months before the earlier of the plan's termination or insolvency (or benefits that were in effect for less than 60 months at the time of termination or insolvency). Similarly, the PBGC does not guarantee benefits above the normal retirement benefit, disability benefits not in pay status, or non-pension benefits, such as health insurance, life insurance, death benefits, vacation pay, or severance pay.

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Notice of Critical Status For National Integrated Group Pension Plan

This is to inform you that on March 31, 2023, the plan actuary certified to the U.S. Department of the Treasury, and also to the plan sponsor, that the plan is in critical and declining status for the plan year beginning January 1, 2023. Federal law requires that you receive this notice.

Critical Status

The plan is considered to be in critical status because it has funding or liquidity problems, or both. More specifically, the plan's actuary determined that the plan is projected to have an accumulated funding deficiency for the plan year ending December 31, 2023.

Critical and Declining Status

The plan is considered to be in critical and declining status because the actuary determined that the plan has an accumulated funding deficiency, the funded percentage was less than 65%, and the plan is projected to become insolvent within the next 15 years.

Rehabilitation Plan

Federal law requires pension plans in critical status to adopt a rehabilitation plan aimed at restoring the financial health of the plan. The law permits pension plans to reduce, or even eliminate benefits called "adjustable benefits" as part of a rehabilitation plan. The NIGPP trustees have adopted a rehabilitation plan that, as the law permits, reduces, or eliminates, benefits called "adjustable benefits" as part of the rehabilitation plan. On April 30, 2010, and on December 1, 2012, you were notified that the plan reduced or eliminated adjustable benefits. On April 30, 2009, you were notified that as of April 30, 2009, the plan is not permitted to pay benefits in excess of the monthly amount paid under a single life annuity) while it is in critical status (including lump sum benefits, with certain exceptions for small lump sum benefits). If the trustees of the plan determine that further benefit reductions are necessary, you will receive a separate notice in the future identifying and explaining the effect of those reductions. Any reduction of adjustable benefits (other than a repeal of a recent benefit increase, as described below) will not reduce the level of a participant's basic benefit payable at normal retirement. In addition, the reductions may only apply to participants and beneficiaries whose benefit commencement date is on or after April 30, 2009.

Adjustable Benefits

The plan offers or offered the following adjustable benefits that may be or have been reduced or eliminated as part of the rehabilitation plan:

Disability benefits (if not yet in pay status);
Death benefit subsidies;
Early retirement benefits or subsidies;
Benefit increases occurring in the 5 years before January 1, 2009;
Joint & Survivor forms of annuity subsidies;
Certain optional forms

Employer Surcharge

The law requires that all contributing employers pay to the plan a surcharge to help correct the plan's financial situation. The amount of the surcharge is equal to a percentage of the amount an employer is otherwise required to contribute to the plan under the applicable collective bargaining agreement. With some exceptions, a 5% surcharge was applicable in the initial 2009 critical year and a 10% surcharge is applicable in 2010 and each succeeding plan year thereafter in which the plan is in critical status. The surcharge will cease to apply with respect to employees covered by a collective bargaining agreement as of the effective date of an agreement covering those employees that includes terms consistent with one of the schedules of the rehabilitation plan.
